Mrs. Dagget is a graduate of first Normal Schools, and is an experienced teacher, uses great skill in training her school, especially in teaching primary reading. The district voted a tax of \$400. for school purposes."

The first school was at Otter Tail City in the early 70's. Both whites and Indians attended. The original building was moved to Ottertail, where it stayed until 1935, when it was torn down. (Too Bad!!)

Teacher was Mrs. S. D. Dragget, 27 pupils, wages were \$40.00 per month.

"Geo. Hammer teacher, 19 pupils. The school is very well conducted. Heard some excellent recitations in primary Geography." Lorenzo Preston, Co. Supt. of Schools

Advocate, April 1, 1874 Dist. No. 15, Otter Tail City
"The Otter Tail City school house was destroyed by fire about four weeks ago, The fire originated from carelessness in the deposit of ashes and embers. It will not be rebuilt.

Dissolved in 1968 and went to Perham.
